Here's how to review your test results, which is especially handy if you've failed a course test and need to retake it



### Find your test

Get started by logging in to the TAL Risk Academy at [riskacademy.tal.com.au](http://riskacademy.tal.com.au).


Once you've logged in:

- 1 Navigate to 'Your Training Record' via the top menu



- 2 From Your Training Record, locate the course name and test you want to review. If you've successfully completed the test, change the status dropdown to 'Completed' to find the test

- 3 Click the down arrow next to the test and then click 'Review'.

5 Where available, clicking 'Show Details' will reveal additional information about some of the questions.
